Rooms

This is just an example of what your room could look like. Each room is 400 square feet (20ftx20ft). You will share a room, but have your own bathroom.

KI PROVIDES

- Two beds with mattresses
- Mini fridge
- Couch (some with pull out bed) or chairs
- Coffee table
- Two armoires (for hanging clothes & drawers)
- Trash cans

REQUIRED PACKING:

- Mattress pad and cover
- Bed sheets (We suggest Twin XL so the sheets can fully fit around the mattress)
- Comforter
- Blankets
- Pillows

- Nightstand
- Book shelf
- Shoe rack

Tips

- When decorating your room, keep in mind you are unable to hang anything on the walls.
- Items on the walls must remain on the walls.
- The doors are magnetic if you want to have some fun with them!
- Bring organizers for under the beds give you more space for clothes, shoes, etc.

The armoires provided in your room will serve as your closet.

Men's Dress Code

Men should reflect a casual business appearance. When attending class, male students are expected to wear nice shorts (not athletic-type) or pants. Jeans with holes or frays are not acceptable. Shirts need to look neat and professional. Collared shirts or plain colored shirts may be worn. Lettered t-shirts and sweatshirts, sweat pants, or white undershirts will not be allowed. Tennis shoes, sandals, and leather flip flops are acceptable. No knit caps, stocking caps, or baseball hats in class. Earrings for men will not be allowed during class and practicum hours.

Women's Dress Code

For class and other Institute events, women should reflect a casual business appearance (some may also say it's close to 2021 church ready!). This may include nice jeans (without holes), cute tops (sleeveless acceptable with modest armholes), skirts, nice shorts (no shorter than mid-thigh) and dresses (no shorter than 3 inches above the knee). Please be sure to maintain modesty in everything you wear. Sandals, tennis shoes and leather flip-flops are all acceptable. Unacceptable apparel includes lettered t-shirts and sweatshirts, sweatpants, and frayed or holey jeans. We love athleisure, but we don't wear it to class. Leggings are not considered pants and should be worn with a dress or shirt that fully covers your rear. No hats will be allowed in class.

Clothing







When choosing what to bring, make sure you pack clothes for the winter/cold months! We will also be doing some work projects or going camping, so pack some clothes you don't mind getting dirty.





Bathrooms

Each room has two bathrooms. Both bathrooms have a sink and toilet. One has a shower/tub combo and the other has a standing shower.

KI PROVIDES

Two bathrooms per room

REQUIRED PACKING:

- Toiletries
- Bath towels, wash clothes, hand towels
- Hand soap
- Cleaning supplies
- Toilet paper and paper towels

SUGGESTED PACKING:

- Bathroom mats
- Bins for any toiletry storage
- Stand up shelving

Both bathrooms have storage underneath the sinks and shelving above the toilets.



Food & Other

FOOD

- All food is to be stored in the dining hall.
- Students are provided with their own bin/cabinet where you can store any non-perishable items in the dining hall.
- Refrigerators and freezers are available to store any needed food. We ask that all food is stored inside a plastic container with a lid.
- Keurig or tea kettles may be kept in our Dining Hall if you want to bring yours.
- We would request for you to bring a microwavable plate, bowl, and mug if you would like to heat up any leftovers. (Not required)

OTHER

- A printer will be accessible in our Library for students to use. The cost is \$.10 per page. You are more than welcome to bring your own.
- Vacuums are available for cleaning the campus.
 Students may also use them in their rooms or you are welcome to bring your own.

THINGS NOT ALLOWED IN ROOM

- TV's
- Video games and video game consoles
- Candles
- Any kitchen appliances (coffee, blender, etc.)
