Tuition Payment Strategy

HOW SHOULD I APPROACH MY BUDGET WHILE AT KI?

We recommend that our students know their budget before coming to KI. Your budget will be the base of all your finances while at KI and will help impact your financial health for the rest of your life. In its simplest terms, a healthy budget will have you spending less than you make. Your budget is the value of your income subtracted by your bills. You will need to create a list of your bills.

Examples of Bills:

- Insurance
- Phone
- Tuition
- Eating out
- Car Payment
- Savings
- Gas
- Emergency Fund
- Tithe

WHAT OPPORTUNITY IS THERE TO WORK WHILE A KI?

Example of Total amount of workable hours

- 20 Weeks at 20 Hrs = 400 Hrs
- 4 Weeks at 40 Hrs = 160 Hrs
- 560 Hrs at \$15/Hr = \$8,400

We recommend that our students work no more than 20 hours per week while at KI. There are 10 weeks in the fall and 10 weeks in the spring that students can work and 4 holiday weeks that we don't have class that students are able to work 40 hours or more. Most jobs are paying around \$13 per hour in the Branson area. It is essential to know your income so that you can know you are able to pay for your bills

WHY WOULD I ASK OTHERS TO INVEST IN ME WHILE AT KI?

We recommend that our students invite others to invest into their future while at Kl. Many of our students have funded their entire tuition by inviting people to partner with them. Don't let shame, fear, pride, or doubt stand in your way. Confidently take this opportunity for your faith to grow and walk in humility and trust that God will provide. The students who have been the most creative and followed through have had the most success!

Example topics to address when inviting others to invest in you:

- Share why you are choosing to attend KI
- Specifically discuss how much you are needing to raise
- People are 90% more likely to give after a third connection
